Grant reported that a Gas Fitter contact has agreed to **NEW BUSINESS** provide a new furnace for the Museum at cost (\$2300) The contractor will also donate his labour costs. Donna moved that up to \$5000 be available for the furnace replacement costs; Marianne second – Carried Bless our student staff Mal, Calum & Ethan for their hard work to clean up the BX Barn and the Bunkhouse. A couple of garbage bags full of plastic balls were donated to Nathan Horton for his motorcross jump pit The Ladies Room upstairs in the Museum has been rearranged with the hat collection displayed in the former typewriter closet Due to the Jasper wildfires and Highway 16 closure; there has been an increase in bus tours stopping at the 108 Rest Area/Heritage Site. There were 3 buses one day and 2 days each had 2 buses stop by. There was an accumulation of \$250 in donations from approximately 88 site visitors from the buses Kelly reported that at the time of the Moose Valley wildfire order/alerts; she registered the Watson Barn and camping on south side of our grounds as a Supplier for evacuees with livestock who were requiring shelter. Locals have indicated that if needed, there are livestock pens available to use on our grounds. Donna mentioned that 4 tents can be used at \$25/day per tent. Hot July Nights 50/50 generated \$1500 to the Heritage Society over 3 draws; the funds will be deposited into the RBC Gaming Account. The HJNs provided \$150 in donations. Kelly suggested that the Heritage Site might want to consider giving Robert a bonus for the added work he has to do during Heritage Site events like July 1st (his contract states that he is responsible for the fuel for his lawncare equipment, supplies (TP, soap & paper towels) Donna will compose a letter to the Ministry regarding special events & buses increased usage of the Rest Area facilities & Heritage Site Accolades to Jolene for the fabulous job she has been

DIRECTOR REPORTS	 Ghost Tours – have been slower than last year, though we started a whole month earlier. There continue to be complaints about the Jail in the Watson Barn; it is slated to be relocated into the BX Barn in 2025 Donna – 153 Mile Store progress – Ralph DeCrane has donated \$2000 to the project. He has also donated a number of tools and implements to the Heritage Site including a Winchester rifle valued at \$750 (the firing pin has been removed for safety purposes) The Patenaud's negotiations with Enbridge are ongoing with hopes for a considerable contribution to the 153 Store move costs Donna has stated that she will compose a letter to both Premier Eby & Prime Minister Trudeau regarding the hopes for governments support for the preservation of the valuable heritage project in relocating the 153 Mile Store. Lee's Flooring donated a child size working excavator; a plaque will be posted to acknowledge the generous donation; as well a plaque acknowledging Ralph DeCrane's generous tool and implements donations will be posted once the display is established,
